Praying that you have had a blessed week and that God is supplying all your needs.

In this morning's message we will be taking a bit of a break from our study of Revelation to recognize a sacred occasion that, especially for Christians, should actually be celebrated every day of the year. And while Thanksgiving is in the forefront of our focus this week, we should most importantly focus on the One to Whom our gratitude should be directed.

We do err as humans if we send our "thankfulness energies" out into the oblivion with no particular addressee. We are not worthy of the least of God's favors and yet His faithfulness and blessings are "...new every morning..."

Your pastor has recently been invited to participate as a team member on this region's state "Critical Incident Stress Management" team which covers five surrounding counties. These teams, assigned to their separate divisions across the state, respond to those times when our law enforcement and fire and rescue personnel have been involved in a particularly tragic incident usually involving a fatality.

As you may have noticed from the news, just this past Monday, a three year old child died as a result, as the paper reported it, "...fatally shot himself with an unsecured semi-automatic pistol that was in the boy's home..." In responding to this tragic scene and in many conversations since, I would simply ask that you keep our county law-enforcement and fire/rescue personnel in your prayers. For these battle tested professionals, the death of a child is especially traumatic...especially if it was avoidable.
